New Laws & Pending Legislation

New Laws:

A-1185 (Chapter 4): Authorizes Public Entities to implement energy savings improvement programs
 A-1386 (Chapter 129): Provides for adjustment and notice of date on which certain elections can occur if date coincides with period of religious observance

Pending Legislation:

A-1551: Establishes "Healthy Workplace Act"
 A-3482: Defines and removes limits on municipal market to affordable programs
 A-3486: Establishes certain ethics protocols for procurement of fire engines
 A-3505: Clarifies that local units of government may enter into shared services agreement for a service that either one of them is authorized to provide
 A-3522: Creates temporary suspension of certain rules of Council on Affordable Housing under certain economic conditions
 A-3541: Extends deadline for municipal certified Recycling Coordinator requirements
 A-3557: Requires local units to provide notification when changing health benefits plan providers
 A-3559: Protects property owned by military personnel and first responders from condemnation
 A-3562: Prohibits imposition of 2.5% non-residential development fee for affordable housing on construction for which development application was deemed complete prior to July 17, 2008
 A-3575: Authorizes creation of local animal health and population control commissions
 A-3591: Prohibits Internet posting of certain information on law enforcement officers
 A-3593: Allows only one PERS-covered position for PERS membership, contributions and service credit; provides for PERS designation of maximum compensation position among multiple positions held
 A-3621: Changes signature requirement for recall petition and when recall may be initiated

A-3631: Provides that any public or non-public building used as a polling place and involved in providing care to children must be closed on general election day

A-3636: Requires municipal court judge to disclose to governing body of municipality information concerning certain decisions by the Advisory Committee on Judicial Conduct

A-3640: Establishes a pothole repair and research program in the Department of Transportation and provides funding from new motor vehicle tire fee revenue

A-3656: Change title of animal cruelty investigator to "municipal humane law enforcement officer" and defines them in statute

A-3657: Concerns extension of certain local government financial agreements

A-3698: Provides for base and alternate bids for certain public contracts; requires contracting unit to specify basis for determining lowest responsible bid and criteria for selection of alternate bids

S-2266: Permits municipalities to recover certain costs and fees from alcoholic beverage licensees charged with violations

S-2292: Revises laws governing provision of affordable housing; reestablishes regional contribution agreement as method of meeting affordable housing obligation; repeals Statewide non-residential development fee

S-2332: Establishes that police cruisers have a useful life of five years and allows local units to bond for such vehicles

S-2372: Permits revenue received by municipality as payments in lieu of taxes to increase cap base upon which permissible increases to final appropriations are calculated under local cap law

S-2390: Prohibits health care institutions from discharging medications into sewer or septic systems

S-2401: Requires issuance of construction permits for installation of wheelchair ramps on residential real property within 3 business days of application

S-2419: Removes Licensing requirement for recreational bingo games

S-2483: Authorizes veterans property tax exemption for totally disabled veteran who did not serve in theater of war.

First Reformed Church

The Rev. Dr. Eugene H. Voss has accepted the call extended by the First Reformed Church of Lincoln Park to become the new pastor of the congregation. A service for Installation and Worship will be held at First Reformed Church, 60 Chapel Hill Road, Lincoln Park, on Sunday afternoon, March 29, 2009 at 4:00 p.m. All are welcome to attend.

Rev. Voss is a native of the Chicago land area. He graduated from Chicago Christian High School in June of 1971. While attending Trinity Christian College in Palos Heights, Ill, where he majored in Theology and Sociology he entered the United States Marine Corp, serving for two years at Parris Island, South Carolina. After his discharge Pastor Gene went back to Trinity to finish his studies and graduated in 1976. During this second stay he worked as a youth pastor at the college's home church of Calvary Reformed Church of Orland Park, Ill.

Pastor Gene married Ruthann Rusthoven on October 5, 1973. After college, they moved to Holland, Michigan where Pastor Gene attended Western Theological Seminary. During these years he served several churches, Beverly Reformed of Wyoming, Michigan, Ebenezer Reformed of Holland Michigan and Thorn Creek Reformed Church of South Holland, Illinois.

Graduating from Seminary in May of 1979 the Voss family returned to South Holland where Gene began his first charge as associate pastor of Thorn Creek Reformed Church. Two years later found them moving to Hospers Iowa to become pastor of the Newkirk Reformed Church where he served for some five years. Eight years of ministry followed at the Beverly Reformed Church of Wyoming, Michigan as senior pastor. 1994 began over eight years of service as senior pastor of Zion Reformed Church, Grandville, Michigan. Telephone Notification: The Borough of Lincoln Park now has the capacity to provide notification to residents in the event of an emergency. This system was used throughout the Flood Watch and Warning. Messages are updated and give important information regarding the potential problems that may occur in a specific area. If you receive such a message, **do not hang up** until the message is over as this might cause the system to determine that the call was unsuccessful. Unsuccessful calls and/or calls picked up by voicemail will be repeated.

If you did not receive any calls and wish to be included, please call Verizon at 1-800-427-9977. There will be a series of prompts. Choose the one that says to make a change to your service. Once a representative comes on you should advise them that you need your phone number updated in the 911 databases. If you do not wish to use the prompts, press zero (0) until a representative picks up.

Siren Notification: Flood sirens are located throughout the Borough and are activated in affected areas as needed. Please note: a wavering siren means flood warning (move cars to higher ground and secure personal items); a continuous siren means Evacuation is Strongly Suggested. **(Please Note: Assisted Evacuations are limited to daylight hours unless it is an extreme emergency. Nighttime evacuations in inundated areas are dangerous to all involved.)**

Cablevision Channel 77: This is the Borough information channel and provides continually updated information on conditions throughout the borough. Please monitor this channel if you have cable TV service.

Information Hotline: During times of emergency this hotline is fully staffed. Volunteers manning the hotline have up to the minute information regarding the status of the emergency. This number is **973-694-0401**.

Borough Website: We are currently working on being able to provide emergency information on the Borough Website. As soon as it is possible to do so, we will have a link available on the website.

A limited number of copies of "Are you ready . . ." the Borough Disaster handbook, are available through the Borough Clerk's office. A new printing will be done and additional copies will be available within a few days. This handbook provides important information for all residents.
