## Police News

I'd like to take this month's journal as well as the December journal to say goodbye as Chief to the community I swore to serve and protect on April 29, 1985. I'd like to share several thoughts and observations having witnessed this part of Lincoln Park's history in as close-up a fashion as one could imagine.

I remember starting and seeing in policing the general tendency to only see the bad in human nature (this is common and somewhat understandable). To be honest most of the day you spend going from call to call or enforcement of motor vehicle or criminal laws and encounter a great many people who are less than truthful to you. Seeing it from that view I can understand the tendency that existed in veteran cops.

However, as a new young officer in 1985 I recall being totally amazed at this worldview. After 25 years I can honestly say that I can understand this position but I also have come to sincerely believe that most people a police officer encounters throughout the day are good people having in many times a very bad day. I never lost my belief that people are basically good in nature, particularly Lincoln Parkers.

I have had the tremendous privilege of working with and later leading, the finest group of men and women in New Jersey. I have said that before and I mean it. Most people do not realize it, but I have seen them day in and out at all hours of the night doing what we expect of them in a professional courteous and at times truly heroic manner. I am extremely proud to have served with the members here and would do it all over again.

Things have changed dramatically since the 1980's. When I started we had four patrol cars (three of which were usually broken down on any given night). This is a prime reason why we have an expanded fleet, the cars are not run as much, do not break down as much and as a result last much longer with fewer purchases from year to year, thank you for your vision Chief Karback.

The car radios were unreliable and the portable radios did not work; there were no computers (how did we survive?). The weapons were revolvers. Domestic violence laws were disturbingly weak and battering was common and disgusting. Until 1989 when the laws were changed, the only way to stop a domestic was to get the batterer to hit you, the police officer instead of a spouse.

Things that have not changed: The ability to connect with people, to break down barriers with a smile, the demand for compassion when it is required. The demand for sternness in the face of being outnumbered or potentially at a physical advantage and not budging. The demand to remain cool in the face of tragic or severe emergency.

Despite computers and technology, crimes are still solved by old-fashioned investigation, interviewing and being a part of the community. I say good bye with my head held high and several medals and honors that I am proud of. Three lifesaving, two valor awards, one 200-club valor award (most proud of that, shared also by Ptl. Simone, and Pfc Nadzam from a 1998 rescue) two honorable service awards for pursuits and barricaded suspects. Hit and kicked numerous times, thanked by grateful citizens even more, attempted to be stabbed once, and paid more for coffee than I ever would have ever imagined because I wouldn't wait for change when well meaning clerks or owners thought they were doing me a favor in front of other citizens by

offering it for free, it made me uncomfortable so I dropped whatever I had in my pocket on the counter and left.

My favorites:

Best rank in the police department – Chief has been great and is an opportunity to form the department to where it should be, but leadership is difficult and lonely at times. My favorite rank was patrol sergeant. You are actually out on the road all the time responding to calls and solving people's problems directly on the ground.

Favorite shift – midnight shift. Even in Lincoln Park many things happen on the overnight, that if you enjoy police work, these are the times you are doing more police work and less service calls.

Worst call – any call involving abuse or abuse of a child, tragedies where you have to keep yourself together when there are families who need you to be strong.
