Summer is here once again, and once again there are many great things to do around Lincoln Park.

Continuing with our commitment to provide healthy, fun and safe things for you and your children to do in town, we have made some great improvements to our Community Lake. First is that the playground and pavilion at the lake will now be available for all residents to use from Labor Day through Memorial Day when the beach is closed for swimming. During the summer when the beach is open for swimming, membership will be required. Lake membership continues to be among the most affordable in the area at \$25.00 for a single and \$50.00 for a family. Following up on last year's addition of the water trampoline, floating dock, kayaks and paddle boats; this year we will be adding a large water slide. Funding for this addition along with many of the previous equipment purchases is from a very kind private donation from a bighearted Lincoln Park resident. We also anticipate having several evening social functions for adults throughout the summer at the lake.

Remember that following many resident requests last year, use of the lake has been expanded to allow non-motorized water craft. This is only available for residents of Lincoln Park and your boat must be registered with the town. For lake members, the kayaks and paddle boats are available for rental during days the lake is open.

I am happy to inform you that the Fourth of July Fireworks celebration held at the LP Nursing home last year will again take place this year. This year, the fireworks will take place on Sunday, July 4<sup>th</sup>. Parking and transportation to the event will be available at several borough facilities. Please watch for further details or sign up for the borough's email newsgroup service.

The Lincoln Park Emergency Services, the volunteers of our two fire companies and the EMS squad, are running their third annual carnival. The carnival will be held on Boro Field at the Municipal Complex from July 13<sup>th</sup> through the 17<sup>th</sup>. Please come out and support the dedicated men and women of our Emergency Services...and have some fun!

Please remember that this time of the year also means school is out, which means more children out playing, and more adults out exercising or enjoying the weather. Please always be aware of pedestrians, bicycle riders, runners, mopeds and motorcycles. It's always a good idea to look twice and save a life.

## Police News

Almost weekly I receive emails from residents regarding "cell phone" use and "texting" while driving. In New Jersey it is illegal to do either. I am sure we have all seen someone checking their e-mail or sending a text when they should have been paying attention to the road.

N.J.S.A. 39:4-97.3 governs the **Use of wireless telephones and electronic communication devices in a moving vehicle.** The statute reads as follows:

1. a. The use of a wireless telephone or electronic communication device by an operator of a moving motor vehicle on a public road or highway shall be unlawful except when the telephone is a hands-free wireless telephone or the electronic communication device is used hands-free, provided that its placement does not interfere with the operation of federally required safety equipment and the operator exercises a high degree of caution in the operation of the motor vehicle. For the purposes of this section, an "electronic communication device" shall not include an amateur radio.

b. The operator of a motor vehicle may use a hand-held wireless telephone while driving with one hand on the steering wheel only if:

(1) The operator has reason to fear for his life or safety, or believes that a criminal act may be perpetrated against himself or another person; or

(2) The operator is using the telephone to report to appropriate authorities a fire, a traffic accident, a serious road hazard or medical or hazardous materials emergency, or to report the operator of another motor vehicle who is driving in a reckless, careless or otherwise unsafe manner or who appears to be driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs. A hand-held wireless telephone user's telephone records or the testimony or written statements from appropriate authorities receiving such calls shall be deemed sufficient evidence of the existence of all lawful calls made under this paragraph.

As used in this act, "hands-free wireless telephone" means a mobile telephone that has an internal feature or function, or that is equipped with an attachment or addition, whether or not permanently part of such mobile telephone, by which a user engages in a conversation without the use of either hand; provided, however, this definition shall not preclude the use of either hand to activate, deactivate, or initiate a function of the telephone.

**"Use" of a wireless telephone or electronic communication device shall include, but not be limited to, talking or listening to another person on the telephone, text messaging, or sending an electronic message via the wireless telephone or electronic communication device.**

Texting while driving is a bad habit that often results in motor vehicle accidents. If it is that important to text someone or use the cell phone, please pull over to the side of the road in a safe area. It will help make the roads safer for all of us.

## New Laws & Pending Legislation

### New Laws:

S-2: Makes various pension system changes concerning eligibility, retirement allowance formula, compensation definition, position eligible for service credit, non-forfeitable rights, prosecutors part, PFRS special retirement, employer contributions

S-4: Makes various changes concerning payments to public employees for unused sick leave, sick leave injury in State service, and PERS and TPAF disability retirement

S-921: Exempts solar panels from impervious surface or impervious coverage designation

S-82: Modifies development applications process under the "Municipal Land Use Law"

S-828: Extends time period for renewal of lapsed alcoholic beverage retail license

### Pending Legislation:

A-575: Prohibits public safety directors from exercising police powers

A-1258: Requires projects with State of local financing to be built to high performance green building standards and provides for performance review and annual report.

A-1480: Clarifies powers of public safety directors

A-1883: Establishes 25-cent municipal court surcharge for all violations; creates grant program for animal shelters funded by surcharge.

A-1896: Requires municipality to comply with State audit prior to receiving State aid

A-2019: Reduces amount of Special Municipal Aid and extraordinary aid awarded to municipalities that have not set limits on the amount of supplemental compensation paid to employees for unused sick and vacation leave.

A-2023: Prohibits certain political subdivision from awarding longevity-based benefits to their employees

A-2024: Prohibits annual bonuses for perfect attendance and the non-use of sick leave

A-2025: Prohibits terminal leave compensation for local government employees

A-2160: Increases and indexes maximum homestead property tax deduction under gross income tax

A-2526: Requires posting on State and local government websites information concerning assignment and use of vehicles

A-2035: Increases threshold amount at which MLUL escrow deposits must be deposited in interest bearing accounts

A-2555: Permits free municipal library funding to be based on actual requirements instead of fixed statutory tax rate

A-2556: Prohibits dual elective office holding and holding of elective office and public office or position

A-2557: Makes various changes to "Uniform Recall Election Law"

A-2582: Authorizes hiring preference for veterans and non-civil service jurisdictions

A-2614: Repeals law allowing PERS member to retire with PERS pension and continue to receive salary for current PERS-covered elective office

A-2619: Revises process for awarding of certain local public contracts

AR-57: Constitutes Assembly Budget Committee to investigate management of the "Special Municipal Aid Act" State and program by DCA; grants committee subpoena power

A-2289: Exempts solar panels from impervious surface or impervious cover designation

S-874: Permits cancellation of municipal charges and fees under \$10

S-975: Clarifies that "entering" a public place for a drug deal is conduct included in C.2C:33-2.1

S-1111: Lowers age of eligibility for surviving spouse under homestead property tax reimbursement program; extends payment of homestead property tax reimbursement to non-eligible surviving spouse for portion

S-1446: Provides one-third of motor vehicle fine money's generated through State Police issued tickets go to municipality where violation occurred

S-1504: Provides immunity to law enforcement officers who, in good faith, release driver in violation of provisional driver's license law

S-1595: Requires mandatory audit of new voter registration records before an election and of absentee and provisional ballots after an election in randomly selected districts

S-1596: Requires excuse for voting by mail-in-ballot

S-1647: Authorizes local law enforcement agencies to hire laid-off Department of the Army police officers without utilizing certain Civil Service lists.

S-1661: Requires candidates for school board member and local elective office to file financial disclosure statement on or before 10th day following deadline for filing nominating petitions for that office

S-1704: Permits voter registration up to 14 days before election.

S-1351: Revises law concerning meetings of public bodies to provide greater public access to meetings and to information about meetings

S-1352: Makes certain changes to open public records act; formally names open public record act "Martin O'Shea Open Public Records Act"

SCR-48: Proposes Constitutional amendment to limit assessment of homestead real property

A-120: Clarifies procedure for determination of discount for prepayment and interest for delinquency on property taxes and municipal charge

A-2119: Includes e-mail addresses in list of confidential items to be redacted from public records under OPRA

A-2120: Requires 25 percent of playground equipment to be accessible by disabled persons

A-2132: Permits local taxing district to refund overpayment of property tax monies paid more than three years ago in certain circumstances

A-2138: Establishes death benefit for certain first aid volunteers and volunteer firefighters

A-2165: Requires municipalities to include unique identifier on signs at certain handicapped parking spots

A-2194: "Property Assessment Appeal Transparency Act"; revises content of required annual notification of real property assessment

A-2263: Requires municipal governing bodies and boards of education to provide sufficient time for all requested public comment at open public meetings

A-2264: Requires local unit to make adopted budget available for inspection by public office, without written request, and to make copies available at reasonable fee

A-2265: Changes home elevation permit height requirement in flood prone areas

A-2275: Prohibits first responders from disseminating photographs of accident victims and patients to public without consent of victim or patient

A-2279: Standardizes maximum fine for violation of municipal and county Ordinances and Resolution at \$2,000.

A-2281: Increases income eligibility limit for reduction or abatement of municipal or county utility authority fees

A-2481: Imposes temporary rollback and freeze on property tax bills to 2009 amounts, beginning August, 2010, until State unemployment rate falls below seven percent

A-2494: Authorizes property tax levy cap banking by local units and boards of education.
