October 2010 – Curbside Recycling One Year Anniversary

Hard to believe that it has been one year since we delivered our yellow and blue curbside containers to your homes. I am pleased to tell you that this program has been extremely successful. When first implemented, we started with twice a month curbside pickup; the participation rate was such that we made an immediate change to weekly pickups. The curbside pickup has proven to be a tremendous cost saving program for the borough, and ultimately for you as residents. In addition, curbside recycling is good for the environment, keeping all of these items out of the landfill. To date your efforts have save over \$150,000.00 in landfill tipping fees alone, not counting what the borough gets paid for recycling materials.

With the inclement weather of snow and ice ahead of us, we have lids available at the Clerk's Office for \$4.00 each. Purchase of the lids will keep your recycling containers clear of any snow and ice debris. It is not mandatory that you purchase these lids.

I thought it a good time to remind everyone what items go in each container.

The Lincoln Park Police Department is encouraging area drivers to be alert now that schools are open.

Drivers need to share the roads with school buses, children riding their bicycles and children crossing the streets.

It is extremely important that drivers remember to stop when the lights on school buses are flashing. Children are not always aware of their surroundings and assume that drivers will stop for them. Drivers should also allow room for the frequent stops the busses make during the morning pick up and the afternoon drop off.

New Jersey has recently passed a new "pedestrian crosswalk" law. The new law requires that drivers come to a complete stop when there are pedestrians in the crosswalk. They must remain stopped until the pedestrian is completely across the area they are crossing.

I know I have written about cell phone use and texting while driving before, however I think it is important to mention it again. **The motor vehicle laws in the State of New Jersey PROHIBIT the use of driving while talking or texting on a cell phone.** With more pedestrian and vehicular traffic during the school year, it is important that we eliminate any of these distractions while behind the wheel.

Please take your time, slow down and be more cognizant of your surroundings. Most importantly: **Drive Safely.**

A Look Ahead

It seems not too long ago that we were bombarded in the press with fears of the H1N1 influenza pandemic. Long lines, delays in shipments and parents scurrying to find a clinic dominated headlines. Recently, the World Health Organization (WHO) published a clinical profile of the H1N1 influenza virus, compiled from studies over the past year.

The report appears in the New England Journal of Medicine, and affirms what was already suspected – the disease had its greatest toll on the young - infants, children and young adults. This is contrary to the seasonal influenza, which exerts its impact on the frail and elderly. Approximately, 90% of those who died from the H1N1 or its complications, were younger than 65, with hospitalization rates greatest in children under 5 years old, and lowest in the elderly. The report states that 25% to 50% of patients, who were hospitalized or died, had no coexisting medical condition. Although the virus was highly contagious, it was milder than previously anticipated.

The H1N1 virus is still circulating and will be one of the strains in the 2010-2011 seasonal influenza vaccine. Even if you received that H1N1 vaccine in the 2009-2010 season, you still need to get vaccinated again in the fall. Immunity from flu vaccines typically last 6 months. Also, the seasonal flu vaccine contains 2 other strains that are circulating. The CDC now recommends that everyone be vaccinated annually against the flu. In addition to the vaccine, good, common-sense practices can help protect you. They included frequent hand washing, cough etiquette, and social distancing when someone is ill. SERMON SERIES "Idols of the Heart" — Most people think of idolatry as an ancient practice that ended centuries ago. But what if we define an idol as anything that takes the place of God in our lives—things like love, power, money, success, or people-pleasing? This series will focus on identifying the idols that own us, and replacing them with something that really satisfies.
