One other volunteer that needs to be recognized this year is Pat Gray. Pat will be stepping down from the Lincoln Park Food Pantry. Pat has been our Food Pantry Director since the very first day we have had a food pantry in town. Pat (and her husband Don) have done a tremendous job of organizing our food pantry and providing very needed services to so many of our residents. I give Pat and Don much thanks and wish them the best of health and happiness.

New Laws and Pending Legislation

Source: NJLM Legislative Bulletin—July, 2010

New Laws:

S-1813: Reduces employer unemployment tax during FY11.

Pending Legislation:

A-108: Prohibits awarding of municipal professional services contracts to certain elected officials

A-2638: Requires municipalities to reimburse qualified private communities for street paving costs

A-2663: Requires correspondence or notice by public entity contain citations of any appropriate statutes, ordinances, or resolutions

A-2679: Provides dedicated line item on property tax bill for the support of municipal free public libraries and joint free public libraries

A-2731: Permits various facilities dealing with dogs to provide municipal dog licenses, and municipal cat licenses where required, with municipal approval

A-2762: Permits levy cap exclusion for certain monies expended by local unit for shared services

A-2769: Provides that subcontractors who furnish non-specialty trade work shall not be named in local public bid documents

A-2786: Permits local units to participate in cooperative purchasing agreements

A-2799: Limits copy fees for OPRA requests

A-2800: Makes part-time elected officials and commission and authority appointees ineligible for PERS, DCRP and health benefits; requires pension credit forfeiture if employed former personal services contractor falsely certifies position as full-time

A-2852: Revises requirement that library tax be assessed against equalized value of property

S-1903: Permits service of beer and wine by certain restaurants

S-1904: Removes plenary retail distribution license limit for certain stores

S-1905: Permits municipalities to purchase and issue certain surplus retail alcoholic beverage licenses

S-1906: Permits certain municipalities to purchase retail alcoholic beverage licenses regardless of population restrictions

S-1911: Prohibits awarding of municipal professional services contracts to members of Legislature

S-1916: Requires mail-in ballot postmarked before election day but received within seven days after closing of polls to be considered valid and counted.

S-1917: Permits certain members of Junior Firemen's Auxiliaries to perform non-hazardous support duties at fire sites.

S-2006: Prohibits municipal zoning ordinances from regulating solar panels under certain circumstances; limits fees for certain renewable energy installations

S-2024: Permits layoff plans as substitute for employment reconciliation plans for joint meetings or shared service agreement under certain circumstances
