## Police News

Before you know it the winter weather will be here. It is extremely important that drivers be as cautious as possible. Roads can be slippery and wet. This is also the time of year when accidents increase dramatically.

Driving can be dangerous no matter what the conditions are, but winter weather poses a whole new set of concerns. Cars tend to break down more in the winter, roads become slippery with snow and ice, and visibility decreases with weather conditions. I know it we be great if we could all just stay inside during the inclement weather, but you know that eventually you will have to drive.

Always check weather and travel conditions before heading out. Do not take chances if the weather is bad; it is simply not worth the risk. Give yourself extra time for travel. Go slow, especially if precipitation is falling or if there is ice or snow on the road.

It's better to drive slowly when conditions are bad. In fact, it's the smart thing to do. Take turns slowly to avoid losing traction. Allow extra space between your car and other vehicles. It takes longer to stop on a slippery road, so double or triple the space you usually leave between you and the car in front of you.

New Jersey law requires that snow be removed from the roof of your vehicle prior to driving. Along with excess snow on the vehicle, windshields should also be defrosted and clear.

Lastly, it is important that you stay alert. While you may be driving safely, others may not be. Pay attention and be prepared for others to make mistakes.

The most important thing however is that you arrive at your destination safely.

New Laws & Pending Legislation; Source NJLM  
Legislative Bulletin

### New laws:

**S-1287:** Makes position of Treasure of School Monies optional.

**A-2031:** Extends time period during which municipal fire department may hire certain laid off firefighters

**S-29:** Reduces school district, county, and municipal property tax levy cap from 4% to 2.0% and permits unused school district, county and municipal increases to be banked for three succeeding years.

**S-2077:** Eliminates minimum threshold for municipal calculation of reserve for uncollected taxes by alternate method when tax appeal judgments reduce the tax levy

**A-1589:** Requires sports and entertainment facilities to submit emergency operations plan to municipal emergency management coordinator.

### Pending Legislation:

**A-2869:** Auth. Certain local enforcing agencies to perform plan review of certain buildings and structures

**A-2931:** Repeals statutory requirement of annual or biennial dog census

**A-2953:** Permits layoff plans as substitute for employment reconciliation plans for joint meetings or shared service agreements under certain circumstances

**A-2954:** Makes various changes to civil service law concerning seasonal appointments, temporary layoffs, and rescinding adoption of civil service.

**A-3056:** Permits municipality to pay tax refund in equal installments over period of three years.

**A-3087:** Requires Taxpayer to provide certificate of merit setting forth estimated true value of certain property which is subject to county tax appeal

**A-3198:** Requires municipal agency under MLUL to notify prospective applicant of potential need for additional governmental approvals.

**S-2194:** The "Child Safe Playing Fields Act" restricts use of lawn care pesticides at schools, child care centers and recreational fields.

**S-2201:** Establishes "Property Tax Levy Cap Task Force" to monitor impact of changes to levy cap law.

**S-2273:** Requires three forms of identification when requesting birth certificates

Dear Resident:

In December of 2006, the Governing Body of the Borough of Lincoln Park Amended Chapter 157 Peddling and Soliciting, of our Code Book.

Included in this Amendment is a provision for a "Non-Solicitation List" which reads as follows:

- "The Borough Clerk shall prepare and maintain a list of addresses of those premises where the owner and/or occupant has notified the Borough Clerk, in writing, that canvassing and soliciting is not permitted on the premises.
2. The Non-Solicitation list shall be updated by the Borough Clerk semi-annually, on January 1<sup>st</sup>, and July 1<sup>st</sup> of each year, based upon the non-solicitation notices received, and shall be supplied to all applicants for canvassing and soliciting permits, and any other person or organization requesting same.
  3. The owner and/or occupant of premises identified on the non-solicitation list, upon registration therefore, may obtain a sign, placard or sticker from the Borough Clerk, which may be affixed to a front door, front window or front facing wall of the premises, and giving notice that canvassing and soliciting is not permitted on the premises."

If you are not already on the list, please complete the lower portion of this letter and mail, e-mail or fax back to me at your earliest convenience. Once I have received your form, a decal for your front door or window will be sent to you advising solicitors that you are on the non-solicitation list.
