News From Chief Andrascik's Desk

This is the time of year when I encourage residents to increase awareness of their surroundings and report any suspicious activity. It is common for people to not act because they are not sure if what they are observing is worth reporting.

When in doubt, call the police immediately! Do not lose time discussing what you saw with friends and neighbors first. If there was a particular person, vehicle or behavior you observed in your neighborhood that you thought was out of the ordinary, it should be reported. We have patrol units out constantly, but we can't be everywhere all the time. That's why we need the community's help.

The following are some types of activity that residents should report including people, vehicles or circumstances that appear unusual or out of place:

Someone you don't recognize in your neighborhood or a strange vehicle parked for a long period of time. Someone looking into houses or vehicles. An unusual amount of traffic coming to a house or apartment. Solicitors without permits, or any stranger knocking on doors. A vehicle you don't recognize driving through the neighborhood. Any other behavior you notice which is not normal in your neighborhood.

If you suspect a crime is being committed call 9-1-1. If the activity simply appears suspicious, you can also call the police non-emergency number (973-694-5533) and describe the activity in detail. We will ask for your name, address and telephone number, but this information is kept confidential.

Dear Resident:

In December of 2006, the Governing Body of the Borough of Lincoln Park Amended Chapter 157 Peddling and Soliciting, of our Code Book.

Included in this Amendment is a provision for a "Non-Solicitation List" which reads as follows:

- "The Borough Clerk shall prepare and maintain a list of addresses of those premises where the owner and/or occupant has notified the Borough Clerk, in writing, that canvassing and soliciting is not permitted on the premises.
2. The Non-Solicitation list shall be updated by the Borough Clerk semi-annually, on January 1st, and July 1st of each year, based upon the non-solicitation notices received, and shall be supplied to all applicants for canvassing and soliciting permits, and any other person or organization requesting same.
 3. The owner and/or occupant of premises identified on the non-solicitation list, upon registration therefore, may obtain a sign, placard or sticker from the Borough Clerk, which may be affixed to a front door, front window or front facing wall of the premises, and giving notice that canvassing and soliciting is not permitted on the premises."

If you are not already on the list, please complete the lower portion of this letter and mail, e-mail or fax back to me at your earliest convenience. Once I have received your form, a decal for your front door or window will be sent to you advising solicitors that you are on the non-solicitation list.
