## From the Desk of Mayor David Runfeldt

During the last few months there have been several events around town that have had the need for “getting the word out” quickly and to many people. Although the borough has made significant strides in providing various methods of communication, it became clear that there is the need to let more people know just where they can find or receive information when they need it.

The easiest and most extensive place to find information is by routinely visiting the borough’s website at [www.lincolnpark.org](http://www.lincolnpark.org). There you can find important information about nearly everything that goes on in town. There are pages for each department, calendars of town and community events, recycling information, links to our stream gauges, ways to report problems, monthly surveys and during emergencies (such as flooding) the home page is dedicated to providing information on how to help you be protected.

Another great way to receive information from town is to subscribe to the borough’s FREE newsgroup email service. A link to join this newsgroup can be found on the home page of our website. Signing up for this service enables the town to send important information about community events and news directly to your email inbox.

Social media has become a new way for people to communicate with each other. Services such as “Facebook” and “Twitter” can help the town better inform you of what is going on.

The borough is currently designing a Lincoln Park Facebook page which will be available shortly. The Recreation Department currently maintains a Facebook page. Many of your elected officials, including myself, use Facebook to keep people updated. During last month’s flooding, I used my Facebook account as an additional way to help get important information out to people quickly. I reluctantly joined facebook several months ago, but now I see how useful it can be.

“Twitter” is the most recent addition to the way the borough can let you know what is going on. Twitter gives us the ability to send short informational text messages directly to your cell phone. This was an extremely effective way to keep people informed during last month’s flooding. News and updates, such as roads that needed to be closed or when they were opened, were sent immediately using Twitter. So many residents told me that this helped them tremendously when trying to return to town after a day at work. Search for [Lincolnpark\\_nj](#) on Twitter to sign up for this service.

Of course, our “Reverse 911” system is the way that the borough can reach you directly by sending a prerecorded announcement to your home phone number. If you did not receive a notification about this past month’s storm, please check with your phone carrier or contact the borough to make sure that you can be added to the call list.

As you can see, there are many methods that the borough utilizes to help keep you informed during times of emergency and for general community information on events and news. It is up to you, however, to look for and/or sign up for this wealth of information. I ask that you take a moment to visit and sign up for some of the sites and services mentioned so that you can become more informed in the community.

## Lincoln Park Police Department News

Identity theft is a serious crime in the United States. The Federal Trade Commission estimates 10 million Americans have their identities stolen every year. Identity theft occurs when your personal information is stolen and used without your knowledge to commit fraud or other crimes. Identity theft can cost you time and money. It can destroy your credit and ruin your good name.

Identity thieves use a variety of methods to steal your personal information. These methods include rummaging through trash looking for bills or other paperwork with your personal information on it, stealing credit/debit card numbers by using special storage devices when processing your card, pretending to be financial institutions, companies or government agencies in emails to get you to reveal your personal information (also known as "phishing"), hacking into your email or other online accounts to access your personal information, and stealing wallets, purses, mail and employee records.

You can deter identity thieves by safeguarding your personal information. Shred financial documents and paperwork before you discard them. Protect your social security number by not giving it out unless absolutely necessary. Don't give out personal information on the phone, through the mail or over the internet unless you know who you are dealing with. Never click on links sent in unsolicited emails. Use up-to-date firewalls, anti-spyware and anti-virus software to protect your home computer. Don't use obvious passwords like your birth date, your mother's maiden name or the last four digits of your Social Security number. Keep your personal information in a secure place at home.

If you are the victim of identity theft you should place a fraud alert on your credit reports. Contact the security or fraud departments of each company where an account was opened or changed without your permission. File a report with law enforcement officials to help you correct your credit report and deal with creditors who may want proof of the crime.

## No Place to Garden?

The Borough has the solution for you, why not try out our Community Garden located in Aqueduct Park across from Wolfsons Market.

One plot (15x25) or half plot (15x12 1/2) per resident.

A one time fee of \$40.00 is payable to The Borough of Lincoln Park and required per plot assignment. Payment can be made either by check or cash.

\$25.00 of this \$40.00 payment is a deposit, this deposit is automatically applied for each year of gardening. If there are no rule infractions, the \$25.00 is refunded to the gardener, once the gardener elects to give up the assigned plot.

\$15.00 of this \$40.00 payment is the ANNUAL GARDEN FEE per plot and is payable to The Borough of Lincoln Park and is required to utilize a garden. Payments can be made by either cash or check.

Gardeners should try to meet the June 1st deadline for planting.

## News from Hose Co. #1

Once again Lincoln Park fell to the forces of nature. A large snow melt in up country and several days of steady rain brought flooding to our borough.

The Lincoln Park Fire Department responded to a number of evacuation calls in the beginning of the week. Then came a lull until March 11<sup>th</sup> when the rivers rose and flooded many of the streets in our community. We were almost an island since many of the roads in and out of town were closed. Then, came the calls for evacuation from the flooded areas. Several hundred residents were removed either by boat or with former army trucks. Included in the evacuation were a number of dogs, cats and even a bird.

Providing a great deal of help were the members of the N.J. National Guard. With a high ground clearance, their trucks were able to drive down many flooded streets. We thank you all.

Fire companies from other communities also came to respond to any fire calls while we were out on evacuations. It was a difficult two days with many firemen staying overnight at the firehouse. Some of them were also flooded out of their own homes.

One of the things that keeps a volunteer fire department going during times such as this is the support of our neighbors. There were a number of organizations that helped to fuel us with food. That included feeding the National Guard Troops, the responding fire companies and ourselves.

We would like to say thank you to the American Legion, Girl Scouts, Emergency Management and the many individuals and businesses who helped us out. We regret that we do not have the names of everyone who helped us out but we would like to thank you for your support.

In December of 2006, the Governing Body of the Borough of Lincoln Park Amended Chapter 157 Peddling and Soliciting, of our Code Book.

Included in this Amendment is a provision for a "Non-Solicitation List" which reads as follows:

1. "The Borough Clerk shall prepare and maintain a list of addresses of those premises where the owner and/or occupant has notified the Borough Clerk, in writing, that canvassing and soliciting is not permitted on the premises.
2. The Non-Solicitation list shall be updated by the Borough Clerk semi-annually, on January 1<sup>st</sup>, and July 1<sup>st</sup> of each year, based upon the non-solicitation notices received, and shall be supplied to all applicants for canvassing and soliciting permits, and any other person or organization requesting same.
3. The owner and/or occupant of premises identified on the non-solicitation list, upon registration therefore, may obtain a sign, placard or sticker from the Borough Clerk, which may be affixed to a front door, front window or front facing wall of the premises, and giving notice that canvassing and soliciting is not permitted on the premises."

If you are not already on the list, please complete the lower portion of this letter and mail, e-mail or fax back to me at your earliest convenience. Once I have received your form, a decal for your front door or window will be sent to you advising solicitors that you are on the non-solicitation list.
