From the Desk of Mayor David Runfeldt

This month marks the 10th Anniversary of the September 11th terrorist attacks on this country which destroyed the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center, damaged the Pentagon in Washington, DC and crashed a plane into a field in Shanksville, Pa. This assault on our nation resulted in nearly 3,000 innocent people killed, including over 700 from New Jersey along with 343 firefighters, 60 police officers, and 8 private emergency medical technicians and paramedics.

Lincoln Park will be commemorating the 10th Anniversary by participating in the **National Moment of Remembrance** at 1:00pm on Sunday, September 11, 2011. Local sirens will be sounded for one minute at that time. Every person is called upon to stop and remember those we lost in the September 11th attacks. Local churches and other institutions are invited to sound sirens or ring bells along with the town.

I would like to take a moment to remember those who lived or grew up in Lincoln Park and lost their lives that tragic day...

There is a memorial to these individuals on George Cobb lane directly across the street from the Lincoln Park Train Station. There is a monument and benches in place to serve as a tribute those from Lincoln Park and all who perished that day. If you get the opportunity this month, please stop by the memorial and place a small flag or a flower to show that 10 years later these people are not forgotten.

Lincoln Park residents are invited to the Morris County Freeholder's observance of the 10th anniversary of 9/11 with a public remembrance Service and Candlelight Vigil on Sunday, Sept. 11. The ceremony will begin at 7 p.m. at the Morris County Sept. 11 Memorial on West Hanover Avenue in Parsippany, across from Morris View Healthcare Center.

The memorial pays tribute to all of those who died in the terrorist attacks in New York, Pennsylvania and Washington, D.C., on Sept. 11, 2001, with a special emphasis on the 64 victims from Morris County whose names are etched in plaques that are affixed to the Memorial. The names of all of the nearly 3,000 people who died that day are engraved in ruby-colored paving stones that have been set in the ground as a walkway surrounding the memorial. The observance will include the reading aloud of the names of each of the Morris County victims.

Parking will be available at the Morris County Department of Human Services building at 340 W. Hanover Ave., in Morris Township. Shuttle buses will transport those in need to the memorial.
