LINCOLN PARK CODE

206-1. DEFINITIONS:

A. Words and Phrases:

Whenever any words and phrases are used in this Chapter, the meaning respectively ascribed to them in Subtitle 1 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey shall be deemed to apply to such words and phrases used herein.

B. Official Time Standard:

Whenever certain hours are named in this Chapter, they shall mean either Eastern Standard Time or Eastern Daylight Savings Time as may be in current use.

206-2. AUTHORIZATION FOR THE CLOSING OF ANY STREET:

- A. The Director of the Department of Safety or, in his absence, disability or inability to act, the Mayor and, in the event of his absence, disability or inability to act, then the Chief of Police of the municipality, is hereby authorized to provide by regulation for the closing of any street or portion thereof to motor vehicle traffic on any day or days during specified hours on any day or days whenever he finds that such closing is necessary for the preservation of the public safety, health and welfare.
- B. Any regulations promulgated by the Director, Mayor or Chief of Police, and in accordance with Section "a" above, shall provide for the posting of proper warning signs of such closing on any street or portion thereof during the time the same is closed in pursuance thereof.
- C. Any violation of this regulation promulgated thereunder shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars.
- D. Any regulation adopted that mandates the closing of any street for a period greater than 48 consecutive hours shall not become effective unless and until it has been submitted to and approved by the **COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.**

206-3. SEVERABILITY:

If any part or part or parts of this Chapter are held to be invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Chapter.

206-4. TOW-AWAY:

Any vehicle parked in violation of this Chapter shall be deemed a nuisance and a menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic, and any peace officer

may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall bear the reasonable costs removal and storage which may result from such removal before re-regaining possession of the vehicle.

206-5. PENALTIES:

Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this Ordinance or any supplement thereto shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars or imprisoned for a term not exceeding Fifteen (15) days or community service for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days.

206-6. EFFECT OF ORDINANCE:

If any parts of this Ordinance are, for any reason, held to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

NOTE: This Ordinance shall take effect after approval by The Commissioner of Transportation twenty (20) days after passage and publication as prescribed by law.

206-7. REPEAL:

All former Traffic Ordinances of the Borough of Lincoln Park are hereby repealed, and all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, except that this repeal shall not affect or prevent the prosecution or punishment of any person for any act done or committed in violation of any Ordinance hereby repealed prior to the taking effect of this Ordinance.

206-8. PARKING:

Regulations not Exclusive:

The provisions of this Chapter imposing a time limit on parking shall not relieve any person of the duty to observe other, more restrictive provisions prohibiting or limiting the stopping or standing or parking of vehicles as set forth in **N.J.S.A. 39:4-138**, any other New Jersey Statute or as hereinafter provided.

206-9. PARKING PROHIBITED DURING STATE OF EMERGENCY:

- A. Upon the declaration of an emergency, there shall be no parking upon streets or sections of streets where temporary **EMERGENCY NO PARKING** signs are displayed. The Chief of Police, or in his absence, the ranking police officer is authorized to declare an emergency and to direct the posting of **EMERGENCY NO PARKING** signs when weather conditions, accidents, road construction, fire or public celebrations dictate or require avoidance of hazards or other conditions which interfere with the free flow of traffic. Notification that

EMERGENCY NO PARKING signs are being or will be posted shall be given to the operator or owner of any vehicle; which has been parked prior to the posting of the signs.

- B. The effectiveness of this Subsection is contingent upon the signs being erected as required by law.

²206-10. TEMPORARY PARKING PROHIBITION FOR SNOW PLOWING AND REMOVAL:

Removal

- A. Whenever snow, ice, or freezing rain has fallen and the accumulation is such that it covers the streets or highways, an emergency shall exist and no vehicle shall be parked on the streets or highways or portions thereof indicated.

The above parking prohibitions shall remain in effect after the snow, ice, or freezing rain has ceased until the streets have been plowed, salted or otherwise treated, sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.

- B. Any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing in violation shall be deemed a nuisance and a menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic and any police officer may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of the removal and storage which may result from such removal before regaining possession of the vehicle.

E. **SIGNS, PAVEMENT MARKINGS, INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE:**

The owners of the premises referred to in Subsection **206-32-A** and **B** shall provide and install signs and pavement markings as required, which signs and markings shall be in accordance with the Manual Uniform Traffic Control Devices. The cost of procurement and installation of the signs and pavement markings shall be the responsibility of the owner of said property. The owner shall subsequently, maintain such signs and pavement markings in good condition at no cost or expense to the Borough. The owner shall be responsible for the repair and restoration or replacement of same.

206-34. TRAFFIC CONTROLS FOR STREET & HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION & MAINTENANCE OPERATIONS:

The Council hereby finds and declares that problems of traffic control occur when traffic must be moved through or around road or street construction, maintenance operations, and utility work, above or below ground which requires blocking the roadway and obstructing the normal flow of traffic, and that such obstructions are or can become dangerous when not properly controlled. In order to better promote the public controls and regulations directed to the safe and expeditious movement of traffic through construction and maintenance zones and to provide safety for the work forces performing these operations, the Borough of Lincoln Park in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, does hereby adopt the current **Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, 1988 edition**, hereinafter known as **M.U.T.C.D.**, except as hereby supplemented and amended, as it controls and regulates whenever construction maintenance operations or utility work obstructs the normal flow of traffic. Any person, contractor, or utility, who fails to comply with the provisions of **M.U.T.C.D.** while performing such work is in violation of this Section.

A. **PRE-CONSTRUCTION MEETING:**

It shall be the responsibility of the person, contractor, or in the case of a Public Utility wishing to conduct work on, under or above the roadway to contact the **Traffic Bureau** of the **Lincoln Park Police Department** in order to arrange a pre-construction meeting, to submit plans for the safe movement of traffic during such period of construction work. Any person, contractor or utility who fails to comply with this Section prior to the start of such work or whose plans are not approved by the **Traffic Bureau** of the **Lincoln Park Police Department** is in violation of this Section.

NOTE: Public Utilities conducting routine maintenance work need not comply with the pre-construction meeting requirement.

B. **EMERGENCY CONTACT PHONE NUMBERS:**

The person, contractor or utility shall provide the Traffic Bureau with at least two (2) emergency contact phone numbers to be called in case of emergency problems at the construction or maintenance site prior to the start of any work. If for any reason emergency contacts cannot be reached, or if the emergency contact person does not respond to a call from the Police Department to correct a hazardous condition, the Borough may respond to correct such hazardous condition.

NOTE: The reasonable fees for such emergency services by the Borough shall be charged to the person, contractor or utility responsible for such condition.

C. **TIME LIMITS:**

There shall be no construction, maintenance operations or utility work under, on or above any roadway in the Borough before the hour of 9:00 A.M. or after 4:00 P.M.

This time limit may be adjusted to permit work prior to 9:00 A.M. or after 4:00 P.M. by the Officer in charge of the Traffic Bureau of the Lincoln Park Police Department. It is determined by the Officer in charge of the Lincoln Park Police Traffic Bureau that the construction or maintenance operations prior to 9:00 A.M. or after 4:00 P.M. would substantially delay traffic or cause a safety or health hazard the work shall then be permitted only between 9:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M.

NOTE: Work on Saturday may be between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. No work on Sundays or Legal Holidays.

D. **ROAD CLOSING AND DETOURS:**

Road closing and/or traffic detours shall not be permitted unless provided by the Lincoln Park Police Traffic Bureau.

E. **TRAFFIC DIRECTORS:**

Traffic Directors shall be posted at all construction or maintenance sites when determined by the Lincoln Park Police Traffic Bureau that same is necessary to provide for the safety and expeditious movement of traffic. Traffic directors shall be qualified personnel as determined by the Chief of Police.

F. **STOP WORK:**

The Traffic Bureau of the Lincoln Park Police Department shall have the authority to stop work, including the removal of equipment and

vehicles, stored material within the street right-of-way, back filling of open excavations and/or other related work, in order to abate any nuisance and/or safety hazard or for any violation of this Section.

G. **EMERGENCY REPAIR WORK:**

In case of emergency repair work where construction maintenance operations or emergency utility work must be performed that will obstruct, interfere or detour traffic on any roadway in the Borough, the person, contractor or utility performing such operation shall notify the Lincoln Park Police Department of such emergency operation. The person, contractor or utility shall disclose the nature of the emergency, location and hours of operation.

All emergency construction and maintenance operations shall be performed with full regard to safety and to keep traffic interference to an absolute minimum. During such work the person, contractor or utility shall comply with the provisions of the M.U.T.C.D. while performing such emergency repair work.

H. **VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES:**

Any person, contractor or utility who commits a violation of this Article shall, upon conviction thereof for a **First Offense** pay a fine of not less than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars and no more than five hundred (\$500.00) dollars and/or be imprisoned in the County Jail for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days or community service for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days. For a **Second Offense**, upon conviction thereof, pay a fine of not less than two hundred fifty (\$250.00) dollars and/or be imprisoned in the County Jail for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days or community service for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days.

For a **Third or Subsequent** conviction pay a fine of not less than five hundred (\$500.00) dollars and/or be imprisoned in the County Jail for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days or community service for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days.

NOTE: A separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.
